SERIES HISTORY

» Colorado leads the all-time series against American, 2-0.

» The two teams have met in the NCAA Tournament before, facing off in the first round in 2001 in Fort Collins, Colorado. The Buffaloes won the match 3-0.

» The most recent matchup was in 2005, also a sweep for Colorado.

NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

» American is no stranger to the NCAA Tournament, qualifying for the Big Dance for 19th time in program history in 2025.

» The Eagles are 3-17 all-time on the national stage, making their deepest run in 2013 to the Sweet 16. AU defeated Georgia and No. 14 Duke, then fell to Texas in the Sweet 16.

» The last time American won an NCAA Tournament match was in 2015, a 3-0 sweep over No. 22 Kentucky.

» Head coach Ahen Kim was on staff as an assistant from 2012 to 2017, contributing to both runs in 2013 and 2015. Overall, Kim has coached in nine NCAA Tournament games as an assistant at AU and head coach at Brown.

TOP STORYLINES

» The Eagles enter the NCAA Tournament after a historic campaign, going 24-4 and winning both the Patriot League regular season title and tournament championship. After losing to Colgate on Sep. 19, they have won 17 matches in a row and swept 13 of them.

» AU won its 17th Patriot League championship in emphatic fashion, sweeping Navy and Army and posting a tournament record .529 hitting percentage in the final against the Black Knights. The Eagles hit .366 across the two games and made just five reception errors.

» Six AU players earned All-Patriot League selections, the most in program history since 2004. The Eagles also swept the conference's major awards, with Deniz Dakak being named both the Player of the Year and Setter of the Year, Sophie Dufour Rookie of the Year, Bella Marrero Libero of the Year, and the Coaching Staff of the Year was awarded to Ahen Kim and his assistants.

»Prinze Zeck earned a First Team selection, and Salme Adeele Hollas and Elise Sterling earned Second Team spots to round out an impressive showing.

» Dakak drives the AU offense, dishing out an average of 10.48 assists per set and driving the Eagles to a .298 hitting percentage that ranks ninth in the country. She was named the conference tournament MVP after dishing out 57 assists and adding 20 digs.

» The freshman sensation Dufour has been AU's most dangerous scoring threat, leading the team with 361 kills and averaging 4.61 points per set. She earned Patriot League Rookie of the Week eight times this season, setting a program record.

» On the other pin is Salme Adeele Hollas, who has been a staple of AU's offensive production. The sophomore transfer from Siena is in a groove as of late, hitting .306 in the conference tournament.

BLOCKS

Dominant Duo Up Front

Zeck and Sterling have been a dominant tandem in the middle, with both of them swinging at a staggeringly efficient rate and denying their share of opposing chances as well. Sterling finished the season with a conference-best .413 hitting percentage, while Zeck hit .396. The former walk-on put on a show in the PL championship match, going 11 for 11 to hit .1000 and set a new tournament record.

Zeck also leads the team with 107 blocks, and Sterling follows with 77.

Keeping it Alive

Marrero has been spectacular at libero, racking up 371 digs and anchoring a defense that held the third-lowest opponent hitting percentage in the country at .140 in the regular season. She logged over 20 digs in four matches, and consistently stepped up against top competition. In one of the most important weekends of the season when AU faced Army and Colgate back-to-back, Marrero took on 35 digs and committed zero reception errors. Her 4.42 digs per set ranks 50th in the country and ties her for fourth all-time in AU's record book, and the sophomore added 78 assists with the second-most aces in league play with 22. Marrero is just the third libero in AU's history to win Patriot League Libero of the Year.

Serving Assasins

The Eagles average 2.34 aces per set this season, the most in the country. The Eagles have pinpointed 225 aces, led by 58 from Alex Ioannou.

A Young Core

Seven sophomores round out the team's largest and most game-experienced class, and the Eagles have zero seniors.

Newcomers

Five new players joined the Eagles in 2025: freshmen Sophie Dufour, Lexie Richards, Alex Ioannou, and sophomore transfers Salme Adeele Hollas (Siena) and Monyay Crowder (LIU). Hollas comes in with the most impressive resume, earning a spot on the All-MAAC Rookie Team after posting 208 kills, 191 digs, and 40 blocks for Siena in 2024.

Growing up off the Grid

The newcomer with perhaps the most unique background is Dufour. She grew up in a handmade, off-the-grid house in Frankfort, Kentucky, with no electricity and no running water. Her mother, Chris Schimmoeller, who was a standout volleyball player at Georgetown College in Kentucky, built the house in 1991. Sophie is trilingual (english, french, spanish) received numerous academic awards in high school, made All-State Choir, and had a stellar volleyball career before AU.

Filling Holes

The Eagles graduated two seniors last year (Esma Sipahi and Bridget Javitch), but lost a total of nine players. Five went to the transfer portal (Sofia Osterdahl, Lilou Stegeman, Sophia Nagy, Holly Hopkins, and Olga Gergacz), and Adelina Berisha and Maiden McLoughlin did not return to the team.

Back in Action

Junior middle blocker Carly Sciborski was sidelined all of her sophomore season last year due to injury, and has made a significant impact in her return to the lineup. The opposite hitter has played in almost every set, logging 129 kills and 49 blocks.

Geographic Diversity

13 members of the 2025 Eagles represent three countries besides the United States, and seven states within the U.S. Two athletes are from Turkey—Deniz Dakak and Zedo Yilmaz, while Alex Ioannou is from Cyprus, and Salme Adeele Hollas is from Estonia.

Ahen Kim

HEAD COACH | THIRD SEASON | 99-59 OVERALL | 40-20 AMERICAN

Ahen Kim enters his third season as head coach of American University volleyball in 2025. He has led the Eagles to back-to-back 20-win campaigns, while guiding three players to major Patriot League awards and six to All-Patriot League selections. Carrying a legacy of success at AU, Kim has spent eight years in the program as both an assistant and head coach.

AU finished third in the Patriot League after a 10-6 showing in conference play in 2024, which included a seven-match win-streak from October 5 to November 1. The Eagles ran through Lehigh, Army (twice), Holy Cross, Colgate, and Lafayette in the heart of Patriot League play. Outside hitter Zedo Yilmaz had an outstanding freshman season, earning AU's first Patriot League Rookie of the Year award since 2019. She ranked second in the conference with 3.91 points per set, while leading the Eagles in service aces with 37. Developing under Kim, Yilmaz set a new program record with six Patriot League Rookie of the Week honors.

In his first season at the helm of the program in 2023, Kim led the Eagles to their best season in four years. On their way to 20 wins, American won seven of its final eight regular season matches before winning another two in the Patriot League Tournament and advancing to the title match at Colgate. Kim coached 2023 Patriot League Player of the Year and AVCA Honorable Mention All-American Zeynep Uzen, as well as 2023 Patriot League Setter of the Year Esma Siphahi. In December following the season, Kim was named one of Volleyball Magazine's Coaching

Hotshots Under 40.

Kim returned to American ahead of the 2023 season, continuing the legacy he started as an assistant to his mentor and friend, the legendary Barry Goldberg. From 2012 to 2017, Kim was a part of five Patriot League titles and AU's historic run to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2013. American defeated Georgia and No. 14 Duke to reach the regional semifinals. In 2015, the team beat No. 22 Kentucky to advance to the NCAA Second Round.

Over Kim's six seasons as an assistant, he coached and recruited three AVCA Honorable Mention All-Americans, six AVCA All-Region performers, and three Patriot League Players of the Year. He oversaw the development of five Patriot League Tournament MVPs, 15 First Team All-Patriot League selections, and 17 Patriot League All-Tournament honorees. Off the court, he mentored three Patriot League Scholar-Athletes of the Year, three CoSIDA Academic All-District selections, and one CoSIDA Academic All-American.

Kim earned his first head coaching job at Brown University in 2018, and he quickly turned around a struggling program over five seasons. He led the Bears to 13 wins in just his second season, marking the most victories in the program since 2001. In 2021, he was named the Ivy League's Coach of the Year after leading the Bears to their first 20-win season and NCAA Tournament berth in 23 years. They went 11-1 in conference play and Cierra Jenkins took home the Ivy League Player of the Year award, also earning honorable mention All-America honors. Under Kim's leadership, Brown became just the second team in Ivy League history to sweep the four yearly awards, and the first team in league history to have five players named First Team All-Ivy. Following the 2022 season, he left Brown

to coach a professional team in South Korea. When the AU job opened, Kim welcomed the opportunity to return to the AU community.

Prior to his time at American, Kim served as an assistant coach at Houston Baptist University during the 2011 season, as an assistant coach at George Washington University in 2010, and as an assistant coach at the Catholic University of America in 2009. He also coached with Metro Volleyball Club in Washington, D.C., from 2013-17, acting as the head coach of the U17 team.

A 2007 graduate of Franklin & Marshall College, he earned bachelor's degrees in Sociology and American Government.

In 2022, Kim married Amy Pauly, a former standout volleyball player at Alabama who was an assistant and associate head coach at the University of Southern California from 2020 until 2023 before recently being announced as the head coach of the Orlando Pro Volleyball Federation.
